## SKY ISLANDS SUMMIT CHALLENGE

### ONE SUMMIT:

Carr Peak (9,236 feet)

This is a 10.8 mile, moderately difficult to difficult hike, gaining 3,680 feet in elevation. Limited to the first 50 challengers. Fee is \$75.

### DOUBLE SUMMIT:

Carr Peak & Miller Peak (9,465 feet)

This is a 15 mile, difficult to very difficult hike, gaining 4,596 feet. Limited to the first 100 challengers. Fee is \$100.

### ELITE TRIPLE SUMMIT:

Carr & Miller peaks, plus Pat Scott (8,517 feet)

This 18.1 mile hike gains 5,146 feet in elevation, is very difficult to most difficult, and suited for extreme athletes. Limited to the first 50 challengers. Fee is \$125.

Hike fees include shuttle transportation to and from the trail heads, Mappy Hour, swag bag, and timing chips. All distances are approximate.

Plan to attend Mappy Hour, from 6:00-8:00 p.m. on Thursday, May 25, or Friday, May 26, at the Windemere Bar (2047 Hwy 92, Sierra Vista) where you can pick up your swag bag, maps, passports, and more.

All Summit Challengers will receive a complimentary pass to the Savor Sierra Vista Wine, Beer & Spirits Festival, two beer tickets, a t-shirt, and other cool swag.

Enjoy this guided walk and learn why the San Pedro River has been named as one of the Last Great Places by the Nature Conservancy. The river features some of the richest wildlife habitat in the United States and is one of the last free-flowing rivers in the Southwest. The walk is about 1½ to 2 miles long over easy terrain. Wear appropriate attire for hiking and weather conditions, and bring at least one quart of water per person.
